Who is eligible for McKinney-Vento services?

A STUDENT OR FAMILY THAT LIVES:

- In a shelter
- Doubled-up with friends or relatives on a temporary basis
- In a vehicle
- In a park, motel or campground
- On a street
- As a runaway

A MCKINNEY-VENTO STUDENT HAS THE RIGHT TO:

- **Attend their school of origin** (known as the “home school”) or the school for the area where the student currently lives.
- **Immediately enroll in school** without providing documents, including proof of residency. You have 30 days to provide the following ::
 - Birth certificates
 - Immunization records
 - Social Security cards
 - Notarized formsSchools **MUST** permit you to enroll, even if you do not have these documents
- **Free lunch** from the first day you enroll
- **Transportation** to and from school (if applicable)
- **Participate in tutoring** and other school-related activities
- **Referrals for uniforms, medical and food assistance**

KANSAS CITY, KANSAS PUBLIC SCHOOLS MCKINNEY-VENTO PROGRAM

- Through our community partnerships, we are able to connect families to agencies that provide emergency services, food, clothing, employment, housing and utility assistance.
- Preschool children have the same rights to our services (except transportation).
- Our program supports the districts’ continuous improvement plan that ensures high school juniors and seniors complete the ACT and have an opportunity to connect with colleges, universities, or technical schools.

- The Parent Liaison assists families to access the resources necessary to ensure immediate needs are met, as well as, moving families towards permanent residency.
- The McKinney-Vento program supports public awareness about homelessness and its’ impact on young people’s ability to learn.
