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Preliminary Descriptive Theme Analysis			
PRELIMINARY THEME	RESPONSES	RESPONSE %	DESCRIPTION
safety	1195	54.39%	Responses highlighted safety concerns, including positive and negative perceptions over wearing masks. Other specific concerns and areas to address surrounded monitoring for the virus and other illnesses, temperature checks, hygiene, cleanliness, sanitization, and disinfection across KCKPS areas.
teaching/learning	1195	15.82%	Responses in this category centered on details, and salient aspects of curriculum delivery, continuous learning, in-person learning, and activities. Responses overlapped with safety, class size, support, social distancing, and alternate schedules when those themes acted as conclusions. Many responses mentioned special education services, grading, accountability for learning, and attendance as well. Also, many responses expressed concerns over both teaching and learning and also returning to in person classes, full-time, some responses provided details regarding underlying health conditions as support for their decision.
support	1195	9.04%	Responses encompassed specific, tangible items needed to the comprehensive role of the family in teaching, learning, and communicating. Responses overlapped with teaching/learning, alternate scheduling, and safety when contextualized around home-based actions, behaviors, or situations. Some responses mentioned needing access to technology training, or other structures to support student continuous learning. Others mentioned classification as essential workers. Some responses within this sub-group mentioned relying on other family or friends, while some also indicated challenges inherent in not being able to ensure adequate learning in the way the schools can.
social distancing	1195	8.70%	Responses centered on brief mentions, and longer content surrounding procedures, questions, and challenges associated with social distancing across nearly every KCKPS area (classrooms, cafeteria, busses, etc...). Responses that mentioned less students in buildings and did not connect that idea to larger ideas of safety were also included in this category. Some responses also overlapped with class size.
alternate schedules	1195	4.35%	Responses in this category spoke directly to blends of online, and in-person learning. Most responses appeared to favor evenly splitting time: half face-to-face, and half continuous learning. Fewer responses spoke to non-equal amounts, resulting in either more time online, or more time in person. Many responses also noted that these schedules could solve potential concerns with distancing, safety, and health, though their solution did not appear to comprise a major portion of the response.
normal return	1195	2.59%	Responses concentrated solely on a desire to open school normally. While nearly all responses provided little to no supporting detail, few responses mentioned a lack of worry regarding the virus, no concerns at all, acceptance of the virus, or that the virus does not appear to affect children (at the present time).
class size	1195	2.01%	Responses noted size of classes as a sole, or primary consideration, with little to no descriptive details provided.
communication	1195	1.51%	Responses centered on regular, frequent, and meaningful information exchange between stakeholders.
appreciation	1195	*****	Responses mentioned good work, or thanks for the opportunity for input.
health	1195	*****	Responses provided little to no detail, other than this word.
