

VACCINES ARE FREE FOR EVERYONE

- People age 12 an older are eligible.
- Available regardless of immigration status.
- No health insurance needed.

THE VACCINE PROTECTS YOU FROM GETTING COVID-19

- The vaccines provide high protection against getting COVID-19. If you still get COVID-19 after being vaccinated, the vaccine protects you from getting seriously ill.
- Even if you have had COVID-19, you should still get vaccinated.
- It is not known yet how long someone is protected from getting sick again with COVID-19.

SIDE EFFECTS ARE NORMAL

- Side effects do NOT mean you have COVID-19.
- Side effects mean the vaccine is teaching your body how to fight COVID-19.
- Side effects may include:
 - Pain or swelling on your arm where you got the vaccine
 - Headaches, chills, body aches, or a fever
- You can relieve your symptoms by resting and taking over-the-counter pain relievers like Tylenol or Ibuprofen.
- Some people will have side effects. Some people will not every BODY is different.

STAY SAFE AFTER BEING VACCINATED

Follow guidance at your workplace and local businesses. Some establishments may require masks or social distancing.



You should still watch out for symptoms of COVID-19, especially if you've been around someone who is sick. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, you should get tested and stay home and away from others.
